Breath sounds	BBS CTA
Chest expansion	Nonlabored, symmetrical

Cardiovascular Assessment	
Heart sounds	S1S2, regular rate and rhythm, no murmurs/gallops/splits
Capillary refill	< 3 seconds
Pulses	Regular, equal bilaterally, 3+
Color	Pink, no cyanosis noted

Gastrointestinal Assessment	
Bowel sounds	Present x 4 quads
Inspection & palpation	Nondistended, no pain or tenderness noted
Last BM	3 days ago, formed, mildly constipated
Nutritional status	Well-nourished, BMI 19.6, normal weight

Genitourinary Assessment	
Urinary	Denies frequency, urgency, or pain
Genital	Denies pain or discharge
LMP	Two weeks ago, monthly, regular

Musculoskeletal Assessment	
ROM	Full ROM left side and lower right limb, limited right upper extremity
Gait	Steady, spine midline
Upper extremities	Left: Symmetrical, muscle strength strong to resistance; Right: Weak, unable to grip
Lower extremities	Symmetrical, muscle strength equal, strong to resistance bilaterally
Other	Reports pain, numbness, swelling in right hand

Integumentary Assessment	
Integrity	Intact
Color	Pink
Temperature	Warm, dry
Skin turgor	Elastic
Other	Bruising, abrasions noted to right hand
Psychosocial Assessment	
Emotional state	Appears distracted at times, does not make eye contact
Behavior	Moaning in pain, rocks back and forth
Personal hygiene	Untidy, poorly groomed
